DAVID'S STORY

This is a true story, but not unusual. Names and some minor details have been changed.

When he was middle-aged, David was under so much pressure at home and work that he walked away, fearing for his mental health. David then sensibly approaches us and explained that he was homeless. Using our phone, David agreed to phone home to tell his family that he was safe. We lent David a tent and sleeping bag and other equipment, which David used for 11 nights on common land, moving every couple of days, We provided David with hot meals at the church and also with food that he could prepare for himself with cooking equipment that we supplied. David visited the project coordinator daily to discuss how he was feeling and coping. After a few days David agreed to see a G.P. We supported him in this visit and eventually he felt able to return home.


